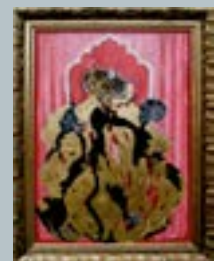

**Christopher Morris** will hold a Q&A after the film.

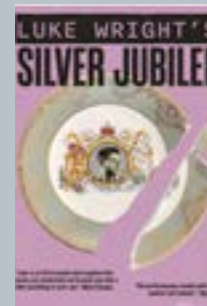
